

IPBS Double Degree

Study Programme Students enrolled on the Graduate Degree Programme (Laurea Magistrale) in Global Business Management can take part in a graduate level double degree programme through a partnership with the IPBS Network. By taking part in the IPBS Master's Programme in Global Management (MGM Master) students on the Università Cattolica Graduate Degree Programme in Global Business Management can obtain a double degree. Their study plans will be integrated into a study programme coordinated by IPBS.

The double degree:

- 1) Graduate Degree in Global Business Management awarded by Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore.
- 2) Either an MSc in Global Management and Digital Competencies awarded by ESB–Reutlingen or an MSc in Global Management (Digital Disruption) awarded by Dublin City University (DCU).

Università Cattolica and the two partner institutions have agreed specific prerequisites for applications to the study programme.

Those students accepted into the programme will spend their first semester of their second year at UCSC and follow the study programme as planned within the Graduate Degree Programme in “Global Business Management.” They will however be enrolled during their second semester at one of the two partner institutions and will follow the respective study programmes as determined by ESB or DCU.

Upon completion of the MGM programme, that is in September at DCU and December at ESB, the students will have the study programme completed abroad recognised as indicated below.

Furthermore, the students will be called during the December final examination session to discuss their thesis they will have completed during their semester at the partner institution, and to be awarded the qualification for the Graduate Degree Programme in “Global Business Management”. The final examination will be conducted in English.

Students participating in the IPBS Double Degree Programme will be expected to pay, in addition to their UCSC annual tuition and university fees, an IPBS fee and tuition for studies at the partner institution (whether ESB or DCU), which, for the 2020/21 academic year, amounts to a total of .7.650.
